




# **Vision for the Future**

Together we can develop a coordinated sector respected throughout the broader seniors' system of care that empowers every older adult to age how they choose and improves health and social outcomes.







# **Issues and Gaps**




### Anticipated Change in Demand versus Capacity Over the Next 3-6 Months


## **Changes in Sources of Funding or Revenue in 2021**


## **CORE Frailty Series** 5 participating groups 77 survey respondents

- 97% of participants indicated the session was useful to their work supporting seniors
- 90% of participants feel empowered to participate in collaborative work to address systemic issues
- 89% of participants feel like they belong to the CBSS sector network in Alberta




